City Manager's Message

The City of Rancho Santa Margarita collaborates with the schools in our community, both private and public, to maximize and improve access to community resources that benefit the students, families and residents of the City. Through this partnership, the Rancho Santa Margarita City Council and Orange County Sheriff's Department (OCSD) Deputies regularly recognize student achievement, expand positive youth development and build stronger neighborhoods. Stranger Danger, safety tips, how to use 9-1-1, Saying No to Drugs and equipment and vehicle demonstrations are just some of the programs recently conducted at campuses throughout the City. School Threat Assessments of facilities located in the City are underway to formulate evacuation plans, identify evacuation sites and command post locations, as well as establish options to house Family Assistance Centers and determine helicopter landing zones in the event of an evacuation scenario. Each spring, the Mayor convenes a meeting of school principals, City staff and members of the Orange County Sheriff's Department to respond to any school concerns. This meeting serves to maintain the positive relationship and line of communication between the schools, OCSD, and City staff as we work together to support students and strengthen the community.

Finally, I am pleased to report that there has been an increase in newly formed Neighborhood Watch groups throughout Rancho Santa Margarita's neighborhoods. I urge you to meet your neighbors and take advantage of all the resources our City's Police Services has to offer.

The City of Rancho Santa Margarita is proud to partner with Sunset Property Services to provide citywide street sweeping services. We are reaching out to residents to bring awareness of the importance of street sweeping and to remind residents of the days your streets are swept. Many residents are unaware that street sweeping is provided not just for the beautification of your City; more importantly, it's for the benefit of our environment.

The more obvious benefit is the collection and removal of paper, leaves, and other visible debris that collect in the gutters. This debris can block storm drain facilities, possibly causing flooding during heavy rains. An equally important, but less visible, benefit is the removal of metal particles and other hazardous waste products left by motor vehicles. Although they are virtually invisible, these particles can be extremely harmful to fish and other wildlife if they reach our creeks, rivers, beaches, and bays. Street sweeping is an effective method of removing both the large and microscopic pollutants that collect on City streets.

Unfortunately, for every vehicle parked on the street on sweeping day, the sweepers have to maneuver the length of two cars to safely service the street; leaving over 40 feet of street un-swept. Please help keep our oceans, streets, and storm drains clean by keeping our street sweeping effective; please reference your street's days of service and move parked cars between the hours of 8:00 am & 3:00 pm on these days.

What is the Neighborhood Watch Program?

A Neighborhood Watch Program is a collaboration



between the police or sheriff's department and the residents of the community to enhance neighborhood security, heighten awareness and to encourage mutual assistance and concern among neighbors.

The Need for the Program

In recent years, neighborhood environments have experienced dramatic change. The well-established and socially interactive neighborhood has been replaced by a highly transient and continually growing community where people seek more and more privacy. This lifestyle tends to create an unfamiliarity with neighbors and a corresponding lack of concern which, in turn, promotes the opportunity for crime and increases the community's vulnerability. This creates the need for a crime prevention program that allows neighbors to work together to ensure a safe and secure neighborhood for their families.

Goals of the Neighborhood Watch Program

The main objective of Neighborhood Watch is to reduce the incidence of crime by:

- Increasing citizen's awareness of burglary and other neighborhood crime through a continuing information program.
- Encouraging residents to watch each other's property and to constantly be aware of the persons and activities in their neighborhood.
- Providing practical tips and resources to assist citizens in reporting crime to their local law enforcement agencies.
