ZeroTrash Rancho Santa Margarita is a volunteer group that meets on the "Zero T First Saturday" of each month to rally together to rid the community of litter. All are welcome; parents, children, students, friends, neighbors – anyone interested in keeping RSM clean!

Volunteers meet in front of Cinepolis/ Panera at 10:00 a.m. and fan out from there. ZeroTrash provides the pickers and bags; volunteers are asked to closely supervise young children at all times, stay on trails and to keep a look out for snakes! Healthcare & Emergency Animal Rescue Team (HEART) provides vaccinations, de-

worming, microchipping, flea and tick control and if time allows, mail trims. Please visit their website for detailed information. Cash or credit card (\$3 processing fee) only; checks are not accepted.

If you have a cat or have pre-paid for your vaccines, you do not need to wait in line and can go immediately to the cashier table. All others will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis (with the exception of those who are physically unable to stand in line).

Important Rabies Information

Please bring a prior Rabies Certificate and other vaccination records with you. A 3-year Rabies Certificate can only be issued if you provide a prior Rabies Certificate. Otherwise, you will receive a 1-year Rabies Certificate.

Vaccines for dogs include:

Rabies - \$7.00 DAP/DHPP - \$20.00 Bordetella - \$15.00 Lyme - \$22.00 Microchip - \$30.00 \$2.00 hazardous materials disposal fee per pet

Vaccines for cats include:

Rabies - (killed virus) Purevax - \$20.00 (1 yr) \$48.00 (3 yr) FVRCP "3-in-1" - \$20.00 FELV - \$22.00 Microchip - \$30.00 \$2.00 hazardous materials disposal fee per pet

"HEART" (aka "SCVVC") is a Non-Profit 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to saving lives and improving pet and wild animal health, safety, and welfare.

Prices are subject to change; clinic will cancel in the event of rain.

The City's annual Flag Day event is a community tradition and features patriotic music and inspirational remarks. This year's event is on Wednesday, June 14th at 6:15 p.m. on the lawn behind City Hall. We encourage you to bring lawn chairs and any worn or damaged US

Flags in need of disposal. This is an opportunity to honor the American Flag in partnership with American Legion Post 862 and many local Boy and Girl Scout units.

The ceremony is held to destroy properly – by burning – worn, damaged or otherwise unserviceable American Flags in a dignified manner in accordance with The United States Flag Code which reads: "As a revered symbol of freedom and justice, the flag of the United States of America needs to be treated with the utmost respect. This respect extends to the flag's eventual retirement and destruction." Flags can be disposed of throughout the year in the flag box receptacle located in the lobby of the Bell Tower Regional Community Center to be included in the retirement ceremony. Public Works - Bulky Item Pickup

Household items that cannot fit into your automated waste carts are considered bulky items. Bulky items must weigh less than 50 lbs and be manageable by a two-person crew.



Common bulky items include:

Couches
Desks
Chairs
Tables
Mattresses
Excess Green Waste

Items that are not accepted include (but are not limited to) car batteries, tires, automotive parts, and construction and demolition debris.

Eliminate Standing Water to Prevent Mosquitoes



Mosquitoes only need ¼ inch of water to breed and they can develop into adults in a container as small as a bottle cap. Mosquitoes are the world's deadliest animals, and warm weather enables them to replicate faster. More mosquitoes mean higher likelihood for disease transmission. To protect yourself and your community, tip all containers containing water, and toss out

containers that you no longer need (and are simply taking up space). For larger containers or areas found with mosquito breeding, call Vector Control to help at (714) 971-2421, or fill out a service request online at ocvector.org.

Home and Vehicle Security: Preventing Crimes of Opportunity

The majority of crimes that occur in Rancho Santa Margarita are property crimes. Criminals are looking for an easy opportunity with the lowest risk; if you provide it, they will take it! In a safe community like

ours, it's easy to forget to lock your car, lower your garage, or protect your valuables. These simple preventative steps can go a long way toward eliminating those opportunities and reducing the frequency of burglaries and thefts in our city.

Home Security

- Make sure the locks are working on your home's doors and windows, and you have strong locks on all entrances.
- Never leave doors or windows open or unlocked while away from home, including second story entries.
- Keep front and side garage doors closed when you're not present in and around the garage area.
- Lock your side garage door and garage door leading to your house at night and when you are away from home.
- Do not leave valuable items outside your home. Thieves may take items from your porch, patio or yard.
- Do not leave valuables in plain view of windows or doors adjust window coverings for optimal privacy while maintaining good visibility of surrounding areas.
- Install motion sensor lighting around the perimeter of your house. Keep front and back porch lights on during hours of darkness.
- Never open your door for strangers. Talk through the door if you do not recognize the person.
- Be aware of people posing as service personnel attempting to gain access into your home. Ask for identification and verify by calling the company.

Vehicle Security

- · Always lock your car doors, roll up the windows and take your keys with you.
- Remove valuables and all items visible when you leave your vehicle. If you need to, lock your valuables in the trunk before arriving at your destination.
- Park in open, well-lit, populated areas. In neighborhoods, park in the garage or off the street.
- Install a locking fuel cap.
- Never leave your vehicle running while unattended.

Public Works - Street Sweeping

The City of Rancho Santa Margarita sweeps public streets free of charge every two weeks to keep our community clean and attractive, to enhance public health and safety, and to prevent debris from entering the storm drain and polluting creeks, beaches, and the ocean.

Please park your car off the street during street sweeping days. By moving your car, the street sweepers will be able to sweep the entire pavement, from curb to curb, and collect all the pockets of debris, oil and grease that collect underneath the cars. Remember, the street sweeper is a large vehicle. When it maneuvers away from the curb to avoid a parked vehicle, it can take two car lengths before the street sweeper can reach the curb again. If several cars are parked along a block, the street sweeper may not be able to sweep the entire block.

Use a broom and dustpan to clean the sidewalk or driveway in front of your home, and dispose of the debris in a garbage can. If you use a hose, the water will carry the debris down the street and into the storm drain where it is carried out to local creeks and then the beaches and ocean. Use a doggie litter bag to pick up after your dog during neighborhood walks. Animal waste can breed bacteria that is harmful to people and animals. Please deposit waste bags in proper receptacles.


