

Would-be burglars know that this is the time of year where you may not be at home as much, whether you are traveling or shopping, and there are likely to be more valuables and cash in your house. So what can you do to keep yourself from becoming a victim? RSM Police Services have few tips to help you protect your home this holiday season.

Decorate Wisely

While a beautiful tree surrounded by presents in your front room creates a picturesque scene, it also shows the world just how many (and what size) gifts you have. Burglars look at this as an open invitation to come in and help themselves. Consider putting the tree in a room away from the street to minimize visibility from a passerby.

Watch The Trash

Be careful what you take out to the trash. For example, you don't want to leave the box to your brand-new big screen right next to your trash can. This tells potential thieves that you have new items of value in your home. If you can, break the box down and put it inside your recycling container. If this is not an option, wait until right before trash pickup to take the box to the curb.

Be Mindful with Social Media

As always, posting on social media that you are going out of town is never a good idea. Neither is posting pictures of all the great gifts you received over the holidays. While you may feel like you want to share your experiences with your friends and family, these sort of posts let bad guys know what is in your house and when you won't be there. If you absolutely must post these things online, be sure that your privacy settings are set so that only those on your friend's list can see your posts.

Meals on Wheels provides nutritious daily meals for seniors ages 60+ who cannot shop or prepare meals for themselves. Deliveries run Monday through Friday and include one breakfast, one hot lunch, and one frozen dinner.

Congregate Lunch at the Bell Tower Regional Community Center (Ages 60+)

Age Well Senior Services is proud to host their Congregate Lunch program on weekdays at the Bell Tower Regional Community Center. Meals are catered by

Zest in a Bowl and feature Italian, Mediterranean, Western, and Asian cuisines, including meats or fish, healthy vegetables, salads, delicious soups, and dessert or fruit. All congregate lunch menu meals are low sodium and supportive of a diabetic diet. There is a suggested contribution of \$5.50, although no one eligible for the program will be turned away for inability to pay. The program offers participants an opportunity to enjoy a hot or cold meal while socializing with friends Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.

Senior Pet Pantry (Ages 60+)

Public Works Recycle From Home™ – Get Paid to Recycle!

Rancho Santa Margarita residents can now recycle cans and bottles without leaving home, thanks to Recycle From Home™—a program inspired by 13-year-old recycling advocate Ryan Hickman.

Here's how it works:

□ Collection bags and QR code labels are provided to sort your CA CRV aluminum cans, plastic, and glass bottles.

□ Schedule a pick-up at your convenience. A driver will collect your recyclables right from your driveway or doorstep.

□ Items are weighed, and your redemption value is calculated based on current CA CRV rates.

□ Payment is sent to you via PayPal, Venmo, or mailed check—typically within 24 hours of pickup.

No more trips to redemption centers—just schedule, set your items out, and let Recycle From Home™ do the rest!

As autumn leaves begin to fall, the City of Rancho Santa Margarita is increasing street sweeping services to address the seasonal buildup of debris. **From October through April, residential streets will be swept twice per month.**

To ensure effective service, please remove all items from the street—including vehicles, basketball hoops, trash cans, and toys.

Street sweeping not only keeps our community safe and beautiful but also protects local water quality by preventing contaminants from entering storm drains.

Thank you for doing your part to keep Rancho Santa Margarita clean!



Each single-family residential customer is entitled to four (4) bulky item pick-ups free-of-charge per calendar year. A bulky item service may include a combination of large items, appliances, or electronic waste.

Emergency Management

Alert OC Emergency Notification System

AlertOC is a mass notification system that keeps Orange County residents and businesses informed of emergencies that may require immediate life-saving actions.

By registering with AlertOC, time-sensitive voice messages from the county or city you live or work in may be sent to your home, cell, or business phone. You can also register to enable text messages on cell phones. AlertOC is also equipped to send alerts to email accounts and TTY devices.

If you have already registered for AlertOC, please log in periodically to see a summary of your information and ensure it's up-to-date. The system uses your selections and information to reach you in the event of an emergency, including evacuation orders.


Public safety and City officials will send official evacuation notifications and information during an emergency through AlertOC. Please ensure you and your loved ones are registered to receive critical information via text, email, or telephone.

Residents in neighborhoods near high-risk fire areas are encouraged to be ready for wildfires by practicing fire safety. Ready, Set, Go! gives you the tools to protect yourself, your family, and your property from wildfires. Firefighters train hard to prepare for wildfires—residents must do the same!

According to the Orange County Fire Authority, holiday décor contributes to millions of dollars in home fire damage each year.

HOLIDAY FIRE SAFETY



The holidays should be enjoyable. To ensure your holiday celebrations are fire safe and injury free, follow these safety tips.



Holiday decorations are responsible for more than \$11 million in home fire damages each year.

Candles

- Consider using flameless candles and flame-resistant candleholders to reduce fire risk.
- Keep candles at least 12 inches from flammable materials and place them on heat-resistant surfaces.
- Keep candles out of the reach of children and pets.
- Extinguish all candles before leaving a room or going to sleep.

Lighting and Decorations

- Check lights for broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires, or loose connections before using.
- Replace burned-out bulbs promptly with the same wattage bulb.
- Don't overload electrical outlets with too many lights or decorations and make sure all extension cords are marked for proper use.
- Plug outdoor electric lights and decorations into circuits protected by ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs).
- Turn off all indoor and outdoor holiday lighting before leaving the house or going to bed.

Christmas Trees

- Place your tree away from fireplaces, radiators, heater vents, air ducts, and other heat sources.
- Make sure the tree is out of the way of day-to-day traffic and doesn't block doorways.
- Ornaments and other holiday decorations should be non-combustible or flame-resistant.
- Remove your tree promptly from your home after the holidays. An ignited tree can be totally consumed by fire in 3-5 seconds, and generate over 2,000 degrees of radiant heat.

The City's Passport Acceptance Office accepts your passport application and forwards all forms and documents to the United States Department of State for processing. ***With families preparing for the holidays and the 2026 travel season, please note that our appointment calendar is regularly booked three to four weeks in advance.***

To increase the efficiency and convenience of booking passport appointments, the City of Rancho Santa Margarita now offers an online scheduling program linked to the Passport Acceptance Facility's calendar to schedule future appointments.

With online scheduling, applicants can use the booking link on the City website's passport page to schedule an appointment at their convenience. Reminder and confirmation emails/SMS messages will also be sent before the selected appointment date and time.

Renewals are not processed at this facility; the State Department accepts renewal applications via mail or through its online passport renewal system. Please visit travel.state.gov to determine if you qualify.

Renewals Are NOT Processed At This Facility

If you are renewing a passport that was issued less than 15 years ago, and you were at least 16 years of age at the time the passport was issued, you MUST renew by mail using Form DS-82 or online by selecting the U.S. Department of State website link [here](#). Select U.S. Passports, Renew or Replace a Passport, Renew Online, and follow the instructions. If you do not meet these qualifications, you will need to complete a first-time passport application, Form DS-11, apply in person, and present the required documentation.



- Use biodegradable, phosphate-free soaps
- Direct rinse water toward landscaping or lawns, not into the street or storm drains
- Use buckets instead of a hose to minimize water usage.
