City Manager's Message



processing fee) only; checks are not accepted.

If you have a cat or have pre-paid for your vaccines, you do not need to wait in line and can go immediately to the cashier table. All others will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis (with the exception of those who are physically unable to stand in line).

Important Rabies Information

Please bring a prior Rabies Certificate and other vaccination records with you. A 3-year Rabies Certificate can only be issued if you provide a prior Rabies Certificate. Otherwise, you will receive a 1-year Rabies Certificate.

Vaccines for dogs include:

Rabies - \$7.00 DAP/DHPP - \$20.00 Bordetella - \$15.00 Lyme - \$22.00 Microchip - \$30.00 \$2.00 hazardous materials disposal fee per pet

Vaccines for cats include:

Rabies - (killed virus) Purevax - \$20.00 (1 yr) \$48.00 (3 yr) FVRCP "3-in-1" - \$20.00 FELV - \$21.00 Purevax - \$22.00 Microchip - \$30.00 \$2.00 hazardous materials disposal fee per pet

Drone Safety

With the use of drones in the region on the rise, the City of Rancho Santa Margarita is encouraging drone enthusiasts to know the rules before they fly their unmanned aircraft over the City.

As part of an effort to educate the public, the City of Rancho Santa Margarita has posted detailed information here about the Federal Aviation Administration's "Know Before You Fly" campaign. The campaign is designed to inform recreational and commercial users of safe and responsible use of drones. The information includes safety guidelines such as ensuring your aircraft stays below 400 feet and does not



intentionally fly over vulnerable people or moving vehicles.

The FAA also requires owners of model aircraft, small unmanned aircraft or drones weighing between 0.55 and 55 pounds to register the aircraft online before taking it to the sky. Other information regarding drone operation, best practices, and safety regulations is available here.



Crime Prevention - Outsmarting "Porch Pirates"

There are no statistics on the prevalence of porch piracy, but mail and law enforcement officials say parcel thefts commonly occur during normal working hours and

virtually every community in our country.

To avoid becoming a victim of package theft:

- If your employer allows it, have packages delivered to your office.
- Request that the shipper hold your package at its pick-up facility so you can pick it up in person at your convenience.

- Have packages delivered to a place where they can be received in person, such as the home of a trusted neighbor, who stays home during the day, or a retired relative.
- If purchasing something from a large retailer, request your package be delivered to a local branch of the store so you can pick it up in person.
- Request a specific delivery date and time from the shipper when you know you will be home.
- Provide delivery instructions to the shipper so that packages can be left at a safe location at your home that is out of sight from the street.
- Sign up for delivery alerts (text messages or e-mails) from the shipper, then call a trusted neighbor when the packages are delivered, and ask them to take the packages inside for safekeeping until you get home.
- Request that the shipper require a signature confirmation upon delivery. This will
 prevent your package from being left at an unattended home.
- Take advantage of secure delivery options offered by vendors such as Amazon Lockers, UPS Access Point, and Package Guard.

Animal Care Services

One of the primary factors that the City Council considered when contracting with Mission Viejo Animal Services Center is their proven success in reuniting lost and stray animals with their owners. However, the center has noticed a recent trend where "Good Samaritans" are finding and holding on to animals rather than turning them over to the Mission Viejo Animal Services



Center. To their credit, these Good Samaritans often post photos and information on social media, but pet owners may never visit those sites or even think of locating their lost pet this way. All animal stray or lost animals should be reported to:

While keeping the lost animal and relying on social media sites may seem like the best bet for a found pet, the truth is doing so makes the chances of reuniting the animal with its family much more difficult. When a frantic pet owner is looking for his or her lost family pet, the first thing that person often does is call or visit the shelter.

To avoid private parties from holding on to a beloved pet, local ordinance requires that "no person shall, without consent of the owner, hold or retain possession of any animal for more than 24 hours without first reporting the possession of such animal to the director, giving his name and address and true description of the animal, and then surrendering such animal to the shelter upon demand." Animals are also considered personal property by the state of California - and it can be considered theft if a Good Samaritan holds on to a lost pet and does not do whatever is necessary to find and return the pet to its owner.

When a stray animal arrives at the Mission Viejo Animal Services Center, the animal is immediately checked for a dog license, scanned for a microchip, and its general overall health is assessed in case the animal is injured. The facility is a no-kill/pro-humane animal shelter, which means if animals are not reunited with their owners, they become available for adoption. Animals are only euthanized if they have a history of aggression and are a threat to public safety or irredeemably suffering from a medical condition that is not treatable. Staff and volunteers ensure each animal that enters the shelter receives everything it needs to remain healthy and happy during its short stay.




