Healthcare & Emergency Animal Rescue Team (HEART) provides vaccinations, deworming, microchipping, flea and tick control and, if time allows, nail trims. Please visit their [website](#) or click [here](#) to view a detailed flyer for more information. *Cash or credit card (\$3 additional processing fee per pet) only; checks are not accepted.* If you have a cat or have pre-paid for your vaccines, you do not need to wait in line and can go immediately to the cashier table. All others will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis (with the exception of those who are physically unable to stand in line).

**Important Rabies Information**

Please bring a prior Rabies Certificate and other vaccination records with you. A 3-year Rabies Certificate can only be issued if you provide a prior Rabies Certificate. Otherwise, you will receive a 1-year Rabies Certificate.

Rabies - \$7.00  
DHP/DHPP - \$20.00  
Bordetella - \$15.00  
Lyme - \$22.00  
Microchip - \$30.00  
\$2.00 hazardous materials disposal fee per pet

**Vaccines for cats include:**

Rabies - (killed virus) Purevax - \$20.00 (1 yr) \$48.00 (3 yr)  
FVRCP "3-in-1" - \$20.00  
FELV - \$22.00  
Microchip - \$30.00  
\$2.00 hazardous materials disposal fee per pet

• Prior Rabies Certificate is required for a 3-year Rabies vaccine; otherwise vaccine will be good for 1 year • Bring other vaccine records if possible • Only healthy pets can be vaccinated • If you have a CAT go immediately to Cashier's table  
 • Fleas & Tick Control available (price depends on pet's weight) • Anal gland expression (\$5) • Prices below are "CASH" prices • NO checks are accepted • \$3 additional per pet for non-cash transactions (Debit/Credit Cards) • \$2 Hazardous Materials Disposal Fee will be charged per pet • Although unlikely, prices are subject to change (current prices are always posted on our website) • Low-Cost Dental Cleanings, Extractions & other Services offered at our Sunday wellness clinics in Orange. (Dentals by appointment only - View our website Calendar for dates) •

We can NOT vaccinate a pet which:

- ✓ Has ever had an adverse reaction to a vaccine
- ✓ Is nursing puppies or kittens

- ✓ Has shown any sign of illness in the past two weeks
- ✓ Might be pregnant

Notify our staff upon arrival if your pet is on medication, is undergoing any medical treatment, or may possibly have any medical/health condition. Keep a safe distance between your pet and other pets & people.  
Dogs must be on leashes & cats must be in carriers (no cardboard carriers allowed).

MICROCHIPS for DOGS & CATS    \$30

(Includes Microchip Registration & 24/7 Lost & Found Pet Recovery Assistance)

ROUNDWORM DE-WORMING    \$13 per dose
TAPEWORM DE-WORMING    \$15 - \$35 per dose

**RABIES** (Thimerosal Free for DOGS & CATS) (12 wks & older)    \$7    (Purevax Non-Adjuvant - CATS only) 1 yr:    \$20    3 yr:    \$48  
 The first Rabies vaccine is good for 1 year, regardless of pet's age. Thereafter, Rabies vaccines are good for 3 years as long as at least 12 months have passed since the pet received its first Rabies vaccination and valid proof of a prior Rabies vaccination by a licensed veterinarian in the U.S. is provided.

**DHP** (Distemper, Hepatitis, Parvo) - or - **DHPP** (DHP with Parainfluenza) (6 wks & older)    \$20  
**BORDETELLA w/PARAINFLUENZA** (Intranasal Bronchiseptica & Parainfluenza) (4 wks & older)    \$15  
**LYME** (Biomela Burgdorferi) (9 wks & over)    \$22  
**FVRCP** (Non-Adjuvant) (Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calici, and Panleukopenia) (6 wks & over)    \$20  
**FELV** (Non-Adjuvant) (Feline Leukemia) (8 wks & over)    \$22

▼ Pets should always receive an initial series of vaccinations, then boosters in one year. Thereafter, annual vaccinations or vaccinations every three years are recommended, depending on the type of vaccine and on the pet's environment. Ideally, pets should receive one of their sets of initial vaccines between 14 to 16 weeks of age to achieve the best immunity against disease. During your pet's initial vaccine series, do not wait longer than 6 weeks apart to have your pet vaccinated and do not vaccinate less than 2 weeks apart. ▼  
 ▼ All pets adopted from shelters or elsewhere when the pet's vaccine history is unknown should receive the appropriate vaccine booster(s) 1 month after adoption. ▼

The City's annual Flag Day event is a community tradition and features patriotic music and inspirational remarks. This year's event is on Thursday, June 14<sup>th</sup> at dusk on the lawn behind City Hall. We encourage you to bring lawn chairs and any worn or damaged US Flags in need of disposal. This is an opportunity to honor the American Flag in partnership with American Legion Post 862 and many local Boy and Girl Scout units.

The ceremony is held to destroy properly – by burning – worn, damaged or otherwise unserviceable American Flags in a dignified manner in accordance with The United States Flag Code which reads: "As a revered symbol of freedom and justice, the flag of the United States of America needs to be treated with the utmost respect. This respect extends to the flag's eventual retirement and destruction." Flags can be disposed of throughout the year in the flag box receptacle located in the lobby of the Bell Tower Regional Community Center to be included in the retirement ceremony.

### Orange County Crime Stoppers

The Orange County Crime Stoppers (OCCS) uses a three part approach to preventing and solving crimes. In partnership with the OCSD, OCCS offers a safe and anonymous way to report criminal activity. Crime Stoppers partners with all forms of media to inform the community on how to anonymously report crimes. Law enforcement then follows up on tips from community members.
